Celebrating 90 years of Exalting Christ through the Camping Ministry

In the summer of 1935, young people from across the southern region of Advent Christian Churches gathered at Dowling Park for a time of leadership training and Bible study. There was also a recreational program for fun and fellowship. Attendance was limited to young people 14 years old and up, with the upper age defined as "so long as one considered himself a youth." That gathering marked the beginning of 90 consecutive years of Christian camping at Camp Suwannee (so far)!

From those earliest days, young people have enjoyed their time at camp. In 1937, a camper was said to have exclaimed, "I wish this institute could go on forever. We have been so happy. This has been the most Christian atmosphere that I have ever been in." Ten days of camp cost \$10.00.

Campers were encouraged to give their hearts to the Lord and to consider fulltime Christian service. Campers were challenged to "commit one's life for service, whether that was behind a desk, in front of a classroom, driving a truck, hoeing a garden, or washing dishes; since every vocation is a Christian call."

Ten years after the first camp gathering, another important Camp Suwannee tradition began. A concrete cross was placed at the bottom of a sinkhole near the camp buildings where campers would gather for worship and Bible teaching. Thus in 1945, the Suwannee Bowl became the spiritual center of the camp. Over the past 80 years, scores of young people have given their hearts to the Lord at The Bowl, and many others have dedicated their lives to Christian service.

As we celebrate 90 years of camping ministry, we can rejoice that today these same traditions and priorities continue. Young people continue to love their week of camp and many remark that they feel closer to Christ at Camp Suwannee, and particularly the Suwannee



Bowl, than anywhere else. Each summer, youth accept Christ as their Savior and many others commit their lives to Christian service at Camp Suwannee. All are encouraged to represent Christ in whatever they do.

Today, camp costs a little more than \$10.00 for ten days. For some, it is a struggle to come up with the funds to attend a week at Camp. That is why your continued help is so important.

Last year, out of 111 campers, 70 received help from camperships. Finances should never keep a child from attending camp and having the opportunity to experience all that Camp offers.

As you read this edition of *Ripples* and the enclosed letter, please prayerfully consider how you can help. You can be certain your support is needed and much appreciated by those who will benefit from your generosity.
